




## MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT TERESA LARA

## MESSAGE FROM DR. NORA DE HOYOS COMSTOCK NATIONAL / INTERNATIONAL FOUNDER

Queridas Comadres.

Since we last gathered for our biennial in 2021, I find that my thoughts take me back to the beginning: to the time when we burst on the national scene like a movement on fire! And I recorded that season in the Acknowledgments section of our book, Count on Me: Tales of Sisterhoods and Fierce Friendships (2012), published by Atria (Simon and Schuster). What started as a quick review of that section turned into a trip down memory lane where I thanked the many of you who made Las Comadres into something tangible, special, beautiful and lasting. And then I started to update the list to bring it up to date. Oh my. I spent the next several days crosschecking and finding many, many names to add because it took soooo many of us to keep all the moving parts in balance. We were building the infrastructure as we grew...creating the structures to keep us connected. And then I looked at thousands of photos on our flicker

upload because they are such important memories. My heart is full and overflowing with the love of our shared experiences. My time and talents (and his) were a gift to us to build our connection and to support the Latina/o community.

And now we find ourselves in a back to the future scenario. We are rebuilding to keep us connected to each other while we re-create the infrastructure; we are coming out of a dimly lit tunnel to the light of a new day, sort of like the wild, wild West (think social media and the metaverse y mas!). I am grateful that Maria Ferrer, our executive director, has stepped headfirst into this leadership role. We are most lucky to have her gift of talent, time and leadership acumen! We are updating our facilitator training so that everyone acting in a facilitator role is on the same page and connected to each other to learn, share, and grow in our ability to serve our local and national networks. Hope you will consider volunteering to lead. Plus, we are considering an in-person national comadrazo in Austin in April of 2024! More on this to come soon... stay tuned and send feedback! # SPECIAL GUEST DOLORES HUERTA



**Dolores Huerta** is a civil rights activist and community organizer. She has worked for labor rights and social justice for over 50 years. In 1962, she and Cesar Chavez founded the United Farm Workers union. She served as Vice President and played a critical role in many of the union's accomplishments for four decades.

In 2002, Dolores received the Puffin/Nation \$100,000 prize for Creative Citizenship which she used to establish the Dolores Huerta Foundation (DHF). DHF is connecting groundbreaking community-based organizing to state and national movements to register and educate voters; advocate for education reform; bring about infrastructure improvements in low-income communities; advocate for greater equality for the LGBT community; and create strong leadership development.

She has received numerous awards: among them The Eleanor Roosevelt Humans Rights Award from President Clinton in 1998. In 2012 President Obama bestowed Dolores with The Presidential Medal of Freedom, the highest civilian honor in the United States.



# DR. MONICA MUNOZ MARTINEZ

Monica Muñoz Martinez is an award-winning author, teacher, and public historian. She is a national authority on race, civil rights, and memory in the United States. Her first book *The Injustice Never Leaves You: Anti-Mexican Violence in Texas* received six best book awards.

She co-founded the award-winning educational nonprofit Refusing to Forget, helped curate an awardwinning exhibit at the Bullock Texas State History Museum, and collaborated with the Texas Historical Commission to unveil four state historical markers in south and west Texas.



She is also a historical consultant for the Smithsonian National Museum of American History. In 2017, Monica received an Andrew Carnegie fellowship, awarded to scholars addressing "challenges to democracy and international order." She is a 2021 MacArthur Foundation Fellow and was named a national honoree for Woman of the Year by USA Today.

Monica graduated from Uvalde High School in Uvalde Texas, received an A.B. from Brown University, and an MA and PhD in American Studies from Yale University. She is now an Associate Professor of History at the University of Texas at Austin.

Her nomination said: "In 2020, while the world took refuge from Covid in their homes, Darlene realized that the farm workers were without resources and she took it upon herself to get donations from friends and vendors to donate food, medical supplies, clothing, etc. What she imagined would be a few boxes of supplies, maybe 3 or 4 cars, turned into a 90-car caravan. Three years later, Darlene and her caravan are still active, and much welcomed by the farm workers. Darlene is the perfect example of a Comadre thinking of her community."

**Ysabella Hincapié-Gara (NY):** "She is a volunteer member of Healing the Children North East, an adjunct Clinical Educator at Lehman College, as well as member of The Blue Door Art Center in Yonkers. Ysabella is not only a caring and loving individual but one who believes in giving back."




